Here is how N.S.Misyuk signed a photo from a family album:

It's me. I am 20 years old. Brave student of the Naval Medical Academy. I was given the badge "Excellent Worker of the USSR Navy". It was pinned on the side of my jacket, and my photo placed on the Board of Fame. They also awarded me a Stalin's scholarship (there was such a one in the past). But fame is short-lived. The badge was stolen, the photo was taken. A scholarship too.



Another signature:

This is also me. I am 34 years old. I sit and leaf through my doctoral dissertation. Four months it will be checked by my teacher, whom I respect, and 8 months by the one I love. For a year it will be in the Scientific Council of GIDUV. But April 13, 1956 will come, and I will defend it. I'm lucky because no one will agree to defend on this day.



And another one:

And here I am too. I am 48 years old. I stand at the table in my office. He is humble and small. Apparently, this is good, modesty adorns a person. This also applies to me to a certain extent. I pose for a "magnitude" of indeterminate scale. Actually, I am the head of the Department of Nervous Diseases of the Minsk State Medical Institute. They say this also means something. Let's suppose.
