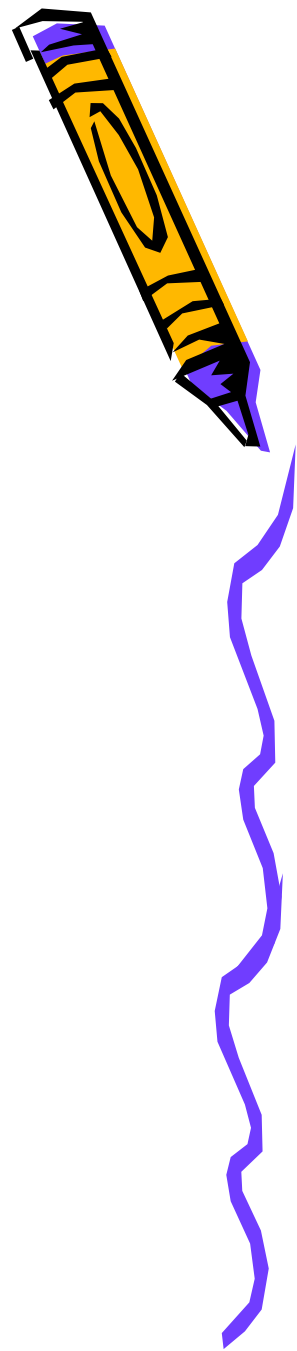

Consistency in joint actions

- the child is shown a sample
- then the adult performs a demonstration of actions with commentary, shows positive emotions,
- if the child does not start actions or does them incorrectly, the adult uses the joint action technique, in which the teacher acts with the child's hands or continues to demonstrate the drawing process himself;
- after completion, the craft is compared with the sample, it is evaluated only positively.

- Shapes (circle, square, oval, triangle)

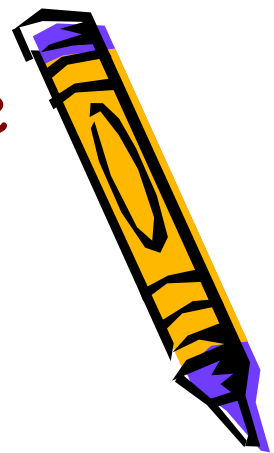


Artistic tool

System of work on the development of fine manual motor skills in children



Includes:

- hand and finger gymnastics,
- exercises for performing movements in a given rhythm,
- tasks aimed at developing voluntary attention.

Hand gymnastics develops free hand movements in children.

Finger gymnastics is usually carried out for 2-3 minutes at the beginning of the lesson or in the middle in the form of physical education.
